

UPDATED WCSD QUARANTINE GUIDELINES 11/1/21 MASK TO STAY/TEST TO PLAY

As of Monday, November 1st, West Carrollton Schools quarantine guidelines have been updated using the latest guidance from the Ohio Department of Health and Public Health - Dayton & Montgomery County (PHDMC), along with our data regarding virus spread within our buildings.

Students, Staff and Visitors are still required to wear a mask at all times in WCSD buildings, unless eating or drinking.

Students are also required to mask during sports and extracurricular activities when able (transportation, locker rooms, sitting/standing on sidelines, and anytime it does not interfere with breathing, the activity or create a safety hazard).

Parents and Guardians must continue to monitor their students daily for any symptoms associated with COVID-19. Any student exhibiting symptoms should be kept home and the parent/guardian should contact a WCSD Nurse for further instructions.

Mask to Stay

Students who have been exposed to COVID-19 in a school environment will be allowed to remain in school as long as they remain symptom-free.

Test to Play (includes all sports and extracurricular activities)

- Student must have a negative COVID-19 test result within 24 hours of exposure notification to continue to participate.
- Student must test again between day 5-7 following last exposure to continue to participate.
- If a student chooses not to test or does not complete required testing, the WCSD Nurse will determine the quarantine timeline from the sport or extracurricular activity only. They can continue to come to school for classroom instruction as long as they are wearing a mask and remain symptom-free.
- All test results must be reviewed by a WCSD Nurse before the student is allowed to continue to play.

Exceptions to the Above:

- Fully vaccinated students will not be required to quarantine unless they develop symptoms.
- Students who have provided proof of an approved positive COVID-19 test within the last 90 days will not be required to quarantine unless they develop symptoms.
